

West Suffolk Council can meet certain aspects of the waste hierarchy but we would obviously not be in a position to influence the prevention element.

This element would be more effectively achieved by the hospital through their own procurement process when purchasing products and/or materials from suppliers which will ultimately require an element of recycling or disposal at the end of their use.

Within the waste hierarchy, West Suffolk Council can provide the following:

### **Recycling**

- DMR collected will be taken to a MRF unless volumes increase then we could bale the plastic bottles at our depot for the recycling process
- Cardboard, collected separately would be baled at our depot for the recycling process

### **Other Recovery**

- Mixed municipal waste and wood/furniture will be taken to an EFW facility

### **Disposal**

- No waste streams will be treated in this way

The waste collection journey

- **DMR/Plastic bottles**

Collected from site in wheelie bins using RCV (the vehicle will carry out multiple collections around BSE) taken to:

From the transfer site, all Dry Mixed Recycling is bulked up with other recycling materials and taken to:

DMR will be sorted through the Materials Recovery Facility to be processed, baled and sold on the global market place for the best rate we can achieve.

- **Cardboard**

Collected from site in the compactor roro skips using a hook loader vehicle to:

All cardboard is baled onsite and sold on the global market place for the best achievable price each week

- **Mixed municipal waste and wood/furniture** collected from site in open topped rolonof skips using a hook loader vehicle will be taken to be bulked up with other mixed municipal waste then taken to:
